Qualifying as a Midwife in 1998 from Napier University Edinburgh, Brona returned to Northern Ireland where she worked in the South Eastern Trust as midwife in the acute and community setting until 2012 during which time she studied part time to achieve a Bsc (Hons) in Midwifery Studies.

Going on to achieve an Msc on Inter-professional Health and Social Care Studies from Queens University in 2012, her research was used by the Northern Ireland Professional Education Centre (NIPEC) to inform the implementation of the Maternity Strategy NI (2012-18).

Brona has served as an elected Board Member and Trustee for the Royal College of Midwives.

Having an interest in improving patient outcomes while enhancing staff satisfaction through collaborative and collective working, Brona has progressed her career in the area of Patient Experience and Governance.
